“The Kaleidoscope of Trauma: Injury and Prevention Across the Generations”

Every year new challenges arise in Pennsylvania that affect all levels of care provided by pre-hospital personnel, physicians, nurses, administrators, social workers, rehabilitation specialists, clergy and others. The Conference Planning Committee of the PA Division of the American Trauma Society examines these issues relevant to trauma prevention and care and attempts to provide speakers with the greatest expertise in current trends and up-to-date information in these areas. This year's two-day conference on **Tuesday, April 26 and Wednesday, April 27, 2011**, will emphasize injury and prevention across the generations.

Among the many highlights of this year's conference will be the Templeton Lecture. This year's Keynote Speaker will be Martin E.P. Seligman, Ph.D. Dr. Seligman is the Director of the Positive Psychology Center at the University of Pennsylvania. His presentation is titled, "Positive Psychology and Positive Interventions."

John M. Templeton, Jr., MD will be presenting "Trauma Update 2011." James Cipolla, MD will present on the timely topic of the safe removal of protective headgear on a possible spine injured patient. Davis Hill, EMT-P will present the newest trends in agricultural injuries. Lieutenant Colonel Graeme Bicknell, Ph.D. will present "Caring for the Care Provider." Robert Reeder, NREMT-P will present "Chemical Burns" while Kathleen Hollowed, RN will discuss the "Current Concepts of Burn Care." ATSPA mini-grant awardee Pat Gifford, RN will present her findings on ATV injuries and safety. Conference attendees will be treated to a "double dose" of Thomas Andrew, MD, Chief Medical Examiner for the state of New Hampshire when he presents "Sudden Unexpected Infant Death: The Bed-sharing Conundrum" as well as the Webb S. Hersperger, MD Lecture on "Detergent Suicide: Description and First Responder Issues," which is given in memory of Dr. John Pryor, an American hero.

OBJECTIVES At the completion of this conference, attendees will be better informed about the ongoing trauma issues in Pennsylvania. Participants will be able to:

1. analyze the most recent trends in trauma related injuries so that they can anticipate the types of injuries they will see in the Emergency Department and provide the best care for those injuries.
2. identify and manage the various types of burns in burn injured patients.
3. gain an understanding of ðdetergent suicideö and the deadly effect it could pose for health care providers.
