

About the program:

KIND CONFLICT is an educational program designed to educate young people (ages 5 - 12) about effective resolutions to settle conflicts.

KIND CONFLICT is comprised of two program manuals: the first manual is for children ages 5 - 9 years; the second manual is for children ages 10 - 12. Both manuals contain similar information, however the information is presented to appropriate age groups.

KIND CONFLICT can be presented in schools, Brownies/Junior Girl Scout troops, Cub Scouts and Scout troops, church youth groups, recreation centers, day care centers, after school programs, etc.

The ATS believes that settling conflicts peacefully is a matter of choice. Therefore, the ATS presents the **KIND CONFLICT** program to teach youth how to settle conflicts without resorting to violence.

CURRICULUM AGES 5 – 9

- Discusses the term “compromise”
- “Shaker” Statements
These statements teach children positive statements about conflict.
- “Feeling Faces” Activity
This activity discusses how important facial expressions are and what they say about how someone is feeling.
- “Object Project” Activity
This activity pinpoints objects that are sometimes used to harm others and quizzes the participants in finding positive uses for those objects.
- The Substitute Song
This song (chant) teaches children alternatives to using violence through a catchy chant.

CURRICULUM AGES 10 – 12

- Discusses the term “compromise”
- Brainstorming Activities
- “Object Project” Activity
This activity pinpoints objects that are sometimes used to harm others. Participants are asked to brainstorm as many positive uses for the objects as possible.
- Role-play Scenarios
Participants are asked to role-play three conflict scenarios. They are challenged to think of responses to conflicts they encounter.
- The Conflict Game
This “Family Feud” style game invites participants to produce what they learned during the program presentation.
