

States Designating EMS an Essential Service





Municipal Responsibilities

- 53 Pa. Stat. § 66553
 - "A township shall be responsible for ensuring that fire and emergency medical services are provided within the township by the means and to the extend determined by the township, including the appropriate financial and administrative assistance for these services."




